

Hooks for Essays to Improve Your Writing

Which Hook to Choose

The type of an essay hook you use depends on the kind of essay you are writing. The only thing you need to remember is that the option you choose should be relevant and appropriate. For instance, if you are writing about the tragedy of the World War I, including an anecdote in the introduction might be not the best idea. Make the hook look natural in the context. Don't use any hook just for the sake of it.

Focus on the thesis statement. There has to be a smooth transition from the hook you choose to it. Your audience has to have a clear understanding of what the text is going to be about and make the decision whether to keep reading it or not.

Essay Hook Type	Example
Surprising information	70% of murders in Detroit go unsolved.
Contradiction	“Men work together whether they work together or apart.” - Robert Frost
Facts	Bill Clinton sent a total of 2 emails during his presidency.
Anecdote	Did you hear about a new restaurant on the Moon? The food is great but there's just no atmosphere.
Dilemma	You know that saving the life of 1 individual will lead to the deaths of 4 other people. Would you still save that individual or not?
Quote	“Perfection is achieved, not when there is nothing more to add, but when there is nothing left to take away.” - Antoine de Saint-Exupéry
Question	Is the modern educational system effective?
Story	When I was a kid I wanted to have a telescope but my family could not afford buying it. I decided that in the future I will be able to have the access to the best one in the world. I worked hard, got a scholarship and nailed the interview for my dream job.
Metaphor	“But soft! What light through yonder window breaks? It is the east, and Juliet, the sun!” - Shakespeare, Romeo and Juliet.
